### SASS Pennsylvania State Championship

North Mountain Shootout XVII, the SASS Pennsylvania State Championship, was held on Memorial Day weekend and hosted once again by El Posse Grande in Muncy Valley, PA. A total of 135 shooters completed the match. The theme this year was "My Heroes Have Always Been Cowboys", with stages honoring cowboy heroes who were veterans of our armed forces, including Clint Eastwood, Hugh O'Brian, Charles Bronson, Dan Blocker, and others.

There were several speed side events, as well as a 3-stage mini-match, to keep shooters occupied on Fri. Six main stages were shot on Sat. and four on Sun. There were a handful of vendors on site as well.

The theme of the 11<sup>th</sup> annual Shootout at Sawyer Flats Tri-State Championship was "They Still Make Westerns, Don't They?". The event, hosted by the Harvard Ghost Riders, was held in Harvard, MA, on June 3-5, with 121 shooters participating.

There were numerous speed side events on Fri., along with a 3-stage Wild Bunch match and 3 CAS/Plainsman warm-up stages. Stories for the main stages (six shot on Sat. and four on Sun.) were actually synopses of Western movies and TV shows, including "Deadwood", "Crossfire Trail", "True Grit", and "3:10 to Yuma", among others. The props were good, as always, and the stages were well-written and interesting with plenty of movement, varied target sizes, shapes, and distances, and lots of shooter's choices. Prior to the awards ceremony on Sun., there was an exciting Top Gun 3-Person Team Shootout.

### SASS Maryland State Championship

Thunder Valley Days XVII, the SASS Maryland State Championship, was held in Damascus, MD, on June 9-11, and hosted by the Damascus Wildlife Rangers. The theme of this year's event was "Sidekicks" with stages dedicated to Western TV show and movie sidekicks such as Gabby Hayes, Andy Devine, and Jack Elam. For some reason, attendance was down a good bit at this year's match with only 84 participants.

Unlike most Fri.-Sun. State matches, this shoot is held on a Thurs.-Sat. Thursday's side events included several speed events and a 3-stage blast. Ten stages were shot on Fri. and Sat. – five per day. The awards banquet was held at the range on Sat. evening.

### End of Trail, SASS World Championship

The 35<sup>th</sup> anniversary End of Trail, CAS World Championship, took place at Founder's Ranch in Edgewood, NM, on June 16-26.

Prior to the start of the CAS match, the Wild Bunch shooters were busy with their own World Championship. Weather for the WB events was tough on the shooters with smoke and ash from a nearby wildfire making air quality "iffy" at best. Temps above normal didn't help matters any either. Nevertheless, 73 dedicated shooters managed to complete the 3-day 12-stage WB main match.

When the WB folks were done with their competition, it was time for the Cowboy Action Shooters to take over the range for the next 5 days. They had multiple warmup stages and various side events available to get them primed for the main event. Although somewhat hotter than normal, the weather for the CAS events this year wasn't too bad. The dust was held down to a minimum due to frequent rain, most of which was thankfully not during the match itself. A total of 612 CAS shooters from around the

world completed this year's 3-day 12-stage CAS main match, up somewhat from last year. The stages were written by Lassiter and T. A. Chance, and the targets were up close and personal and VERY Gunfighter friendly (Lassiter is a Gunfighter – hmmm!). Two different moving targets and a few pistol and rifle knockdowns helped keep things interesting.

There were plenty of things to keep shooters occupied at the ranch even when not actually slinging lead. Many vendors were on site, although their number seemed to have dwindled even further this year. During the day, there were free stagecoach rides available, longhorn steers to check out, the mounted shooting competition to watch, and Gatling guns to shoot. There was also daytime entertainment on some days and various nighttime events throughout the week as well. The Top Gun Shootoffs were held just prior to the final awards on Sun., with the top 8 WB men and women and the top 16 CAS men and women battling it out.

A big congrats to CKR member, **Annabelle Bransford** who shot clean and took 7th in Ladies Senior. Her hubby, Rowdy Bill, also shot clean but unfortunately missed getting a Top Ten buckle in his class by a measly 30 rank points (only 6/10 of a second behind the 10<sup>th</sup> place winner). ☹
