

CKR WINNERS AT OTHER MAJOR MATCHES

SASS Eastern Divisional Championship

The Thurmont Rangers hosted the SASS Inaugural Eastern Divisional Championship, the Mason-Dixon Stampede, in Thurmont, MD, Oct. 1-4, 2015. (As you may recall, in previous

years, this venue had been the home of the SASS Northeast Regional.) Unfortunately, Mother Nature was in a nasty mood this year, and a Nor'easter rain event put a major damper (pun intended) on the match. Although nearly 275 shooters originally registered to compete, only 181 stuck it out to finish the match. It was indeed unpleasant weather, with highs in the low 50s, occasional heavy rain, and an otherwise constant drizzle. Tex, SASS #4, and his better half, Cat Ballou, were there to witness what could have been a great event, but alas, ended up with most shooters having the attitude of "let's get this done and get outta here." What a shame!

Regardless of the weather, the host club made sure there were plenty of activities available over the 4-day event. On Thurs. folks had the chance to shoot numerous side matches, a Wild Bunch Mini-Match, and a CAS 3-Stage Blast, or to attend RO I and II classes, a Doily Gang Ladies Only Clinic, or a Shotgun Reloading Clinic. The main match was shot Fri. and Sat. (5 stages each day), followed by dinner and entertainment at the range each evening (Cat Ballou's birthday party Fri. and games of chance on Sat.). The theme of the main match was "The Best of John Wayne" with stages celebrating such classic John Wayne Westerns as "Rio Bravo", "The Shootist", and "True Grit". On Sun., those still wanting to throw more lead had an opportunity to participate in more side events prior to the awards ceremony, which was

then followed by the Top 16 Men's/Ladies Shootoff.

There were several good vendors on site throughout the event, although due to the weather they got very little business, I'm afraid.

SASS New Jersey State Championship

The 12th annual SASS NJ State Championship, Purgatory in the Pines, was held in Jackson, NJ, on Oct. 16-18th. A total of 139 shooters (one more than last year) participated in the match, including a few CKR members.

In keeping with the Halloween season, the Jackson Hole Gang decided to make the theme of this year's shoot "The Haunting at Purgatory". The stages were based on old, mostly really bad, western horror movies, like "Billy the Kid vs Dracula", "Jesse James Meets

Frankenstein's Daughter", and "Riders of the Whistling Skull". There were some very creative props used to carry out the theme, and the stages were fun and varied – with a knockdown plate rack (for pistol), Texas Star (for rifle), swinger (like the one at the CKR mine), and shotgun poppers which threw soda cans rather than clay birds. The weather was perfect for Fri.'s numerous side events and CAS and WB 3-stage blasts. Shooters were also given the option of wearing Halloween costumes that day, and there were a few really great outfits, including NY newlyweds Cold Brook Kid and Spinning Sally as a sailor and his "catch" (a lovely, fast-shootin' mermaid). Clever! Costuming went back to normal for the 10 main match stages shot on Sat. and Sun. And it was a good thing because the rather chilly weather meant multiple layers were needed. Thankfully, it was sunny and dry with minimal breeze, making the colder temps much more bearable. There were a handful of vendors on site throughout the weekend, and several nice prizes were raffled off at the awards ceremony on Sun. Trophies were very nice as well. All-in-all, a great shoot, and a good time was had by all!
